## ETHANOL & FUEL

MOST OF THE FUEL AT INDIANA GAS STATIONS CONTAINS CLEAN-BURNING ETHANOL MADE FROM CORN. A BY-PRODUCT OF ETHANOL PRODUCTION IS DRIED DISTILLERS GRAINS (DDGS), WHICH ARE FED TO ANIMALS.

## ANIMAL FEED

ANIMAL FEED IS THE #2 USE FOR CORN LOCALLY. CORN IS FED TO ANIMALS SUCH AS PIGS, CHICKENS, TURKEYS, AND COWS, THAT GIVE US FOOD LIKE MEAT, EGGS, AND MILK.

## EXPORTS

CORN IS ALSO A KEY EXPORT COMMODITY. MARKETS FROM ACROSS THE GLOBE RELY ON CORN FROM INDIANA.

## FOOD & INDUSTRIAL

CORN IS USED FOR MAKING MANY OTHER PRODUCTS SUCH AS PLASTIC, MEDICINE, TIRES, STRAWS, AND CUPS. CORN IS ALSO MADE INTO FOODS LIKE CHIPS, CEREAL, BEVERAGES, CORN SYRUP, AND MORE.
